New Objects

Mei's Life is an expansion for the game In the Palm of your Hand. You must have the base game to play this.

Add the tongs and the pompom to the base game objects. It's up to you to imagine what "feelings" they might allow you to invoke!



Will you use the tongs to surround something, delicately pinch, grab, or to represent a long object?

Will the pompom enable you to represent a fur coat? Or will you dangle it from a finger by its metal ring to represent a wedding ring, or a hanging object visible on the Memory card?



Mei's Memories

Shuffle these Memory cards together with the base game's cards. Mei's fate is intertwined with Léon's.

Biography Bonus

The cards are numbered in their **lower-right corners**. If you arrange them from 1 to 50, Mei's life unfolds before your eyes. There is also a second number in the lowerright corner to indicate when this occurs in Léon's life. For example, card 7-3 is the 7th card in

Mei's life, which happens around the same time as the 3rd card in the base game. This allows you to arrange all 150 cards from the base game and this expansion to form a single timeline.
